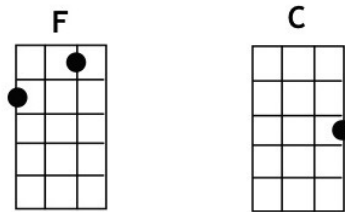


# Clementine
